## **About The Sanctuary**

In the early 2000's yard owner, Julie Blake, rescued several horses who were deaf, blind, or unwanted. Over time, Julie's herd expanded as she rescued more and more horses. Eventually, Julie's yard had become a horse sanctuary, taking on volunteers to help care for the horses and expanding rapidly. Julie realised that the sanctuary could not survive without additional income. Already working 3 jobs to keep the sanctuary going and, in fear of it closing down, Julie decided to apply to become a registered charity. It was in 2016 that Cecil's Horse Sanctuary successfully became a registered charity.

But why 'Cecil's' Horse Sanctuary? Well, the name Cecil comes from Julie's miniature Shetland foal who was stolen off her yard in 2014. Cecil the foal was also named after Julie's dad who had recently passed away from cancer. So in memory of Julie's father and her foal Cecil, the sanctuary was named after them.






## **Pony Birthdays**
